Port Stanley Memorial Tournament

Rules and Regulations

1. This is an OMHA sanctioned tournament. All teams must be registered with the OMHA or its affiliates. An OMHA-approved roster is required for entry in the tournament.
2. All OMHA Rules and Regulations will apply to tournament games, including minimum suspensions. Any “fighting” penalty will result in automatic suspension from the remainder of the tournament.
3. Registration is 45 minutes prior to your first game. All team officials must sign in Gamesheet prior to each game. iPads will remain at the tournament table.
4. All teams will be guaranteed three games. Teams must be ready to play 15 minutes prior to each scheduled game time. There will be a two-minute warm-up prior to each game.
5. All games will be played as 10-10-10 stop time periods. In the event of a five-goal or greater lead in the third period, the game will switch to run time for as long as the lead remains.
6. There are NO TIME-OUTS in round-robin games. Each team will have ONE 1-minute time-out in playoff (quarter-final, semi-final, and Championship) games.
7. There is NO OVERTIME in round-robin games; in the event of a tied score at the end of the third period, the game will be scored as a tie.
8. Teams will be awarded TWO points for a win, ONE point for a tie, and ZERO points for a loss.
9. Ties in the standings after completion of all round-robin games will be resolved in the following order of tiebreakers: head-to head record (among two tied teams only); most wins; goal differential; least penalty minutes; coin flip. Standings will not be considered final until announced by the tournament director.
10. In the event of a tied score at the end of the third period in playoff games, five-minutes of three-on-three sudden-death overtime will be played. If a penalty is called during overtime, play will be four-on-three until the end of the penalty. Play will then proceed as four-on-four until the next whistle and then return to three-on-three.
11. If a playoff game remains tied at the end of overtime, there will be a three-player shootout. If the shootout is tied after the first three shooters, the shootout will proceed as single-player sudden-death until a winner is declared. Players from each team will always shoot simultaneously. No player can shoot twice prior to all players shooting once.
12. All referee and tournament director decisions are FINAL and may not be appealed.
